Drainage and Flood Mitigation Projects in Your Area

[Denver, CO, February 2021] Mile High Flood District (MHFD) is partnered with 41 local governments to master plan drainage improvements throughout the Denver Metropolitan area; design, construct, and maintain stream corridors including removal of trash and debris; provide flood warning services, and develop resources related to improving water quality in our streams. MHFD is pleased to inform you about the projects we are planning in 2021 for your county.

Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) Projects:

This program leverages local government dollars to fund stream projects that reduce flood risk and provide community amenities. The 2021 Work Plan includes the following projects for Jefferson County:

- North Dry Gulch – Lamar to Teller
- Weaver Creek – at Belleview Avenue
- Lena Gulch – Heritage Road to Zeta Street
- Big Dry Creek and Hylands Creek – Upstream of Sheridan Boulevard
- Walnut Creek – US 36 to Wadsworth Parkway
- Ralston Creek – at Croke Canal
- Leyden Creek – at Croke Canal
- Moon Gulch – at Indiana Street
- Lena Gulch – Maple Grove Reservoir Spillway

Studies:

Watershed Planning studies that have been requested or sponsored by municipalities within Jefferson County in 2021 include:

- Dry Gulch Flood Hazard Area Delineation
- Lena Gulch and Tributary H Major Drainageway Plan and Flood Hazard Area Delineation

Stream Maintenance Efforts:

This program helps local governments manage publicly-owned reaches of regional streams. The 2021 Work Plan includes the following efforts for Jefferson County:

- Annual Vegetation Management & Debris Removal
- Sediment Removal
- Restoration Projects
- Minor Repairs
