Projects in Your Area

[Denver, CO, March 2022] Mile High Flood District (MHFD) is partnered with 41 local governments to master plan drainage improvements throughout the Denver Metropolitan area; design, construct, and maintain stream corridors including removal of trash and debris; provide flood warning services, and develop resources related to improving water quality in our streams. MHFD is pleased to inform you about the projects we are planning in 2022 for your county.

Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) Projects:

The CIP program leverages local government dollars to fund stream projects that reduce flood risk and provide community amenities. In 2022, MHFD plans to work on the following projects throughout Boulder County:

- South Boulder Creek upstream HWY 36
- Gregory Canyon Creek – Arapahoe Ave. to Pennsylvania Ave.
- Coal Creek – at Centaur Village
- Drainageway A-1 at Garfield Avenue
- Coal Creek – 2nd Ave to McCaslin Boulevard
- Boulder Creek – at 95th Street
- Dry Creek at Baseline Road



Watershed Studies:

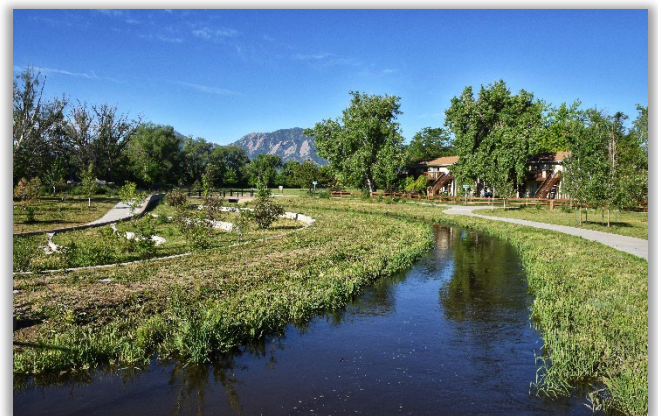
Watershed Planning studies that have been requested or sponsored by municipalities within Boulder County in 2022 include:

Stream Maintenance Efforts:

- Sediment Removal
- Restoration Projects
